New Module

Output Management Module

The Output Management Module is used to organise and distribute the various outputs from ACS-Embrace, in a simple, effective and flexible manner. With the advent of environmental awareness, paperless offices, web interfaces and customer self-service, ACS-Embrace has addressed the need to manage the distribution and archival of document and report outputs.

Standard documents and reports can be stored in a variety of formats, including

- CSV spreadsheet format
- PDF portable document format
- Raw text

Output Management allows for the distribution of reports and print documents to

- Printers
- Archive folders
- Email recipients
- a combination of these methods

Output Management can be configured to dynamically create archive folders on a shared network drive, hosted on a document server, according to a variety of user-defined options. These include sub-folders for branch, document date, user, period, document type, document number, customer or supplier.

Users can browse the folders, providing they have security access, either using Windows Explorer or from within the new Embrace Explorer and click on the document they wish to view on the screen or route to the printer.


Documents can be configured for storage in PDF format, with a third party product, Lincoln PDF Converter, which is used to generate high quality, small footprint PDF documents.

The electronic delivery of output via email drastically reduces the costs associated with day-end and month-end reporting, cutting down on wastage and minimising environmental impact.

Archived documents can be linked directly to source transactions, using the new document attachments feature, delivering further benefits from Output Management.

From small to large enterprises, this scalable and flexible offering can be set up with minimal effort, allowing additional access to a vast array of information, whilst access to sensitive information remains controlled by the extensive security and other advanced features within the ACS-Embrace environment.

A "Quick Start" for BustQue



Embrace *QuickStart* was successfully implemented at Bustque, in March, this year. The implementation took all of one week. Yes, you read

Products were being sold below margin, or even below cost and customers were exceeding their credit limits. Previously we had to physically go into the warehouse to check, do the necessary calculations and hours later call the customer back. Now, we can answer the query immediately as the information displays on the screen.

FAQ (Frequently Asked Question)

Q How do I "copy and paste" from Embrace into an Excel Spreadsheet?

As with any screen data, including the GL Account Enquiry, go to the Embrace *Edit* menu item at the top of the Embrace Desktop screen, choose *Select All* and then choose *Copy*. Then in your spreadsheet, select *Paste* and paste the data directly into Excel Spreadsheet.

An entire grid or selected columns from a grid may be copied to a document.

To copy the whole grid, click on the Grid Caption, if there is no grid caption, click on each column.

To copy selected columns, click on the columns to copy.

Q How do I import Embrace Reports into an Excel Spreadsheet?

A Any 6000 series report can be exported to a CSV file and then opened with Excel.

In Embrace 13.0 certain 5000 series reports, for example the Chart of Account Listing & Trial Balance reports, can be exported to a CSV file and then opened with Excel.

When printing a report to *Screen*, a screen/page at a time can be copied & pasted into Excel. All the data will be in one column but the Excel "Text to Columns" feature could be used to split the data to various columns.

Embrace User Tips


Function Keys are used to gain quick access to Embrace enquiries and can be activated from anywhere in Embrace, including from a menu and from within a program.

User defined function keys are F1 to F10 and are used together with the Shift Key. Example: Shift+F3 might be programmed to activate the Stock Status Enquiry.

F4 displays your Function Key setup.

U2 Update

We are awaiting the much-anticipated new release of UniVerse version 11.1. This will be a 64-bit version and is going to be released on HP-UX at the end of this month. The Windows release will follow later this year. Version 11.1 will be a major release, with exciting new features, which include:

- A new generic system
- External Database Access, which will allow you to access a table in another database, as if it were a native UniVerse file
- XAdmin, the new administrative tool that allows you to add some of your own tools

and take some of the U2 tools away
 A new tool for mapping U2 data into a normalized format, as well as the new ODBC

Another exciting feature soon to be released is the U2DataVu. This is a reporting/BI tool, which has a native interface into U2 and enables you to:

- Draw standard query reports
- Deliver enhanced reports with graphics
- Create dashboards with drill down ability
- Output to Excel and PDF
